Massie Welcomes New Minister

Kara McCluskie from the newly formed Georgian Shores United Church in Owen Sound will be the new pastor at Massie. Born and raised and still happily living in Owen Sound, Kara comes with experience in childrens', youth and family programming. She started formal paid ministry in 2006, and is currently working on completing her studies for her Designated Lay Minister recognition.

At Georgian Shores she performed a wealth of duties including organizing curriculum, leading vacation Bible camp, assisting with funerals and lots more but she only gave 2 or 3 sermons a year so her new job comes with a bit of a learning curve. As Kara says, "Right now, as it is my first charge as solo minister, I hope to stay above water for the time being! Sermon prep is taking a lot of brain power!"

Kara's family has been wonderfully supportive of her new calling. Her husband Brian and youngest daughter Alana attended her first service in Massie (and Chatsworth) while older daughter Charla was at camp. We hope to see all three at some of the Massie services in the future.

Kara has a great love of music. "I was blessed to have been raised in a very musical family, so I am quite passionate about music, and see music as very spiritual. I sang with the Georgian Bay Concert Choir BC (Before Children!). Currently I am a member of a vocal ensemble named Cricket. There are 8 singers plus a piano player, Ann Marie MacDermid (leader of Shoreline Chorus). We got together 15 years ago to learn jazz, but we do a wide variety of music: contemporary, folk, classical, sacred, African. The group consists of music teachers and clergy. Three of us are ministers. We joke that we might change our name to The Preachers and the Teachers! I also play the flute. I find it helpful to accompany the hymns especially when they are unfamiliar. I will do the occasional solo, so I'm looking forward to playing it in the Chatsworth/Massie churches as well. I dabble a very little bit on the guitar, mostly with the children to accompany camp songs. I might bring it out once in a while when I get my nerve up!"






